Profiled in Peter Matthiessen's classic *The Snow Leopard*, George Schaller is among the world's preeminent conservation biologists. He has done research in 23 countries, on species as diverse as the snow leopard, tiger, mountain gorilla, giant panda, Mongolian gazelle, Tibetan antelope, and Marco Polo sheep. He is a senior conservationist with the Wildlife Conservation Society, vice president of Panthera, and author of 16 books. He will discuss his field studies in some of the world's most remote wilderness and will sign books.
